

ROBERT QUINNEY, organist, choir director, & musicologist,

has directed New College Choir since 2014. Alongside his work with the choir he continues his career as a concert organist across the world, and combines this with his role as a Tutor of Music in New College and an Associate Professor in the Faculty of Music.



A noted performer of Bach's keyboard music, whose recordings have received critical acclaim, he has continued New College Choir's long tradition of expertise in 18th-century music, presenting regular liturgical performances of Bach's music alongside solo performances on the organ and harpsichord.



Journeys of the Mind—Bach's Clavier-Übung

A series of musical explorations

Bach waited until 1726 to publish his music, choosing a title in common usage in 18th-century Germany: *Clavier-Übung*, 'keyboard practice'. Behind the prosaic title lie four volumes of dazzlingly inventive music, diverse in style yet linked by certain guiding principles and Bach's characteristic search for completeness. In two organ recitals featuring the third book of *Clavier-Übung*, and a lecture-recital featuring performances on the harpsichord and organ, Robert Quinney explores this remarkable collection, its place in Bach's oeuvre, and the reconciliation it attempts between the didactic and the virtuosic.

Choral Masterpieces

Join New College Choir for one of their regular Bach performances: termly *Cantata Vespers*, in which a cantata is presented in a liturgy based upon the Vespers Bach himself knew in Leipzig; the *St John Passion*, also presented liturgically in New College Chapel; and a concert performance in the University Church of Parts IV–VI of the *Christmas Oratorio*.

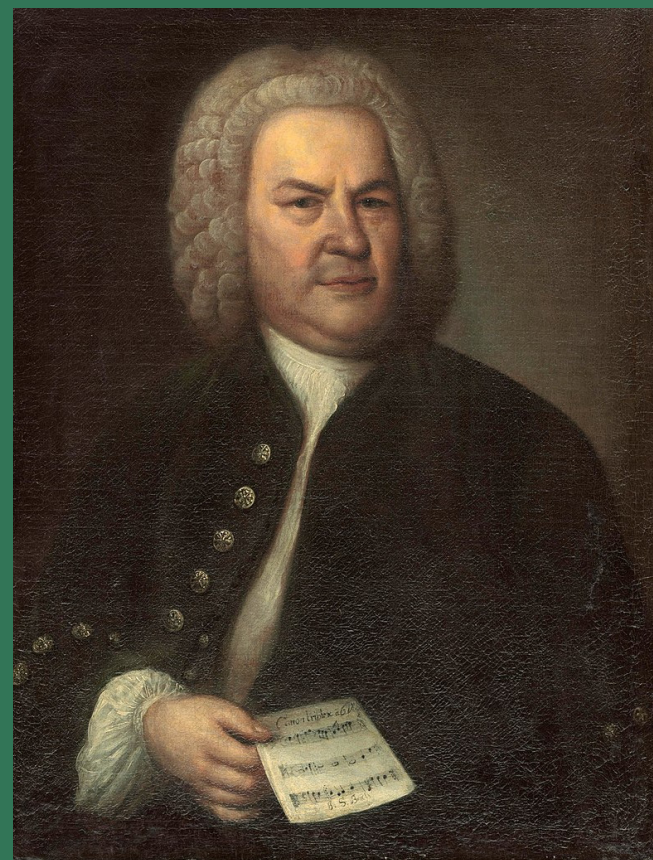
