Opportunity Oxford

As part of the University's commitment to widening access to Oxford, a new academic programme launched in 2020 to help support offer holders from under-represented backgrounds. Opportunity Oxford is designed to help students explore and develop high-level academic skills prior to starting their course. New College made 10 offers for the Opportunity Oxford programme for 2025 entry.

Oxford Cymru

Students from Wales are under-represented at Oxford. To help change this, three Oxford colleges, including New College, have launched Oxford Cymru; an extensive community outreach programme, offering bespoke and local support to students of mixed ages, their families and teachers. This year 9% of our UK offer holders are from Wales.
